AS MATHEMATICIANS WE ARE

...learning about: place value and the four operations throughout this term as we develop our work and confidence with written methods.

AS READERS AND WRITERS....

...we will be creating our own Roman themed adventure stories when writing to entertain. Creating reports for our Romans theme and studying/creating our own play-scripts.

AS INVESTIGATORS WE ARE.....

SCIENCE: Skeletons and movement. Considering and studying how the body moves and how it protects itself, alongside how to keep a healthy body, in the context of advising the Roman forces about how to improve their legions.

AS ENQUIRERS WE ARE.....

GEOGRAPHY: Studying Ribchester as a typical Roman settlement and what they brought to this region. We will also be studying how the Romans moved natural resources effectively from one place to another and how this set the trend for the present day.

HISTORY: After starting by looking at the Stone, Bronze and Iron Ages, the children are charged with considering what the Roman brought to Britain and whether these changes improved every day life for the native people by studying Ribchester in particular.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION: How celebrations bring a sense of belonging to Hindus and then considering whether Christmas has lost its true meaning.

AS COMMUNICATORS WE ARE.....

COMPUTING: We will begin by developing our control work on a device for creating Roman mosaics. We will then move into coding work, where the children are required to design a route for invading forces.

FRENCH: Our first unit! Greeting in French. Single digit numbers and colours. Where is France on a map of the World? What are its key features?
